Jenny Featherstone - Zambia -PH Day 7 Pray with us:

Our first recorded case was in mid March, when a small group came back from a wedding in South Africa. They were put into isolation for 21 days tested and 5 discovered to be positive. To date the number of positive tests and deaths continue to rise, and now at the end of April are increasing rapidly on a daily basis, and spreading across the country, including among health care workers. Wearing of masks is now compulsory, and only 'essential travel' allowed (although there is no definition of

(although there is no definition of this) but people are still allowed out and to meet as long as social distancing is observed. Borders are closed, but this also means food supplies are severely restricted too. Pray with us:

- Here in Italy, we seem to be starting to turn a corner. There has been a fairly steady drop in the number of new cases over the past seven days. Whilst I suspect that we still have a long way to go, this is very encouraging news. It helps us all to make sense of the very severe restrictions which have now been in place here for almost one month.
- I suspect that you will have requests for many prayers along similar lines at
 - present. However, if possible, I'd be most grateful if you'd add these specific points, please:
- Compassion, to enable those who are presently living on the streets and in ghettos to be safely accommodated and fed, irrespective of their migration status;
- Altruism, to enable those afraid that their own needs will not be met to exercise restraint when they shop and to share what they have with others;
- Vision, to enable all of us to see how society might function differently when we emerge from this crisis;
- Wisdom, to enable leaders to steer us safely through the hard times and build strong foundations for the future.

- Our health facilities in Zambia are minimal and like South Africa, we are expecting many people in the compounds to suffer.
- We will have difficulties limiting gatherings like weddings and especially funerals to 50(the guidance so far) as culturally that is unheard of.
- Having already suffered a severe drought, food shortages and rampant inflation our poorest are struggling and don't seem to understand the swingeing contagiousness of the new virus. We pray for mercy at this time of pandemic.
- We have very few testing and health facilities, and very very few ventilators. Health workers have to find their own PPE, and most people are frighteningly ignorant about the reasons for isolation.
- The government also has not always been clear about its strategy.
- Jenny is self-isolating, with any visitors limited to the veranda where we could sit and talk 2 meters apart and where they had their own hand washing facilities.
- We are on our way to a huge outbreak of covid 19. The government has announced it doesn't have enough funds for a lockdown. The hospitals are already overflowing with patients so, in our area, Choma General has decided to make Njase clinic the centre for Covid19 cases. It is a small but very busy clinic

and has maybe 6 -10 maternity beds? I don't know if it has been provided with testing facilities or ventilators. Zambia is in this very precarious situation.

• We pray that God will spare us from the misery and economic collapse that threaten to overwhelm us.

Keith & Ida Waddell - Zambia -Day 7

Pray with us:

- We are praying too for you all in Europe and all over the world, as we hear of the death toll rising and people in lock-down
- We spent a whole day in conclave working on pastoral guidelines to protect the Church and keep ahead of the virus. Dr Msiska, Ida and I argued for the strongest measures, emphasising prevention, avoiding overcrowding, social distancing. We were the first Zambian Church to cancel Sunday Worship.
- With a very fragile Health Service, it would soon be overwhelmed if we were to have an Italian Scenario developing. Most people in Lusaka live in overcrowded compounds, many are immune-compromised and malnourished, so the consequences of a serious outbreak here is unimaginable. There are no ventilators; testing is rudimentary and tracing does not always work. As the Italian PM said, We do our best here on

earth, then heaven help us. That is all we can do here.

- We are now in self-isolation at Mwandi. Ruairidh Fiona & girls, the same, outside Luasaka. Catriona and Will are in Lusaka. Will still working! Gregor is moving into his curacy in North Wales next month without public ordination. Kirsten, Stewart and their two are in lock-down in Lenzie.
- We give thanks for Science and medicine and for all medical care workers. Doctors, Nurses Pharmacists Cleaners Ambulance Crews, Cooks Refuse Crews and other essential workers.
- We pray for good stewardship of financial and medical resources at this time
- We pray for continued national unity and working together for the common good and that greed selfishness and profiteering will cease
- We pray for a holistic ministry from the Church that meets the Spiritual Physical Social and Economic needs of people
- We pray for all Churches to stand together, to protect it as our Lord did, by giving his life for us. The Lord bless and keep you.

Claire Smithson - Kenya -PH Day 8

Barbara Dickenson, currently in Kenya with Claire writes: Kenya still has few cases of COVID19 reported, but also not so many tested. Three Coast counties and Nairobi are in lock-down, but not as yet Meru County. When there is news of any spread (confirmed cases) then the entire county (each county is quite large) is closed down. Police are very much in evidence and enforcing the travel ban. It must be very difficult for so many of the population who rely on selling what they grow in order to purchase other necessities. Before the lock-down comes to Meru county we are still able to go shopping and do some normal things, but a little differently. Every shop, no matter how small was offering soap and

handwashing. The boda-boda drivers (motorcycle taxis) wear masks and are restricted to one passenger per bike.

Social distancing is happening in various places.

The hospital is facing difficulties as they prepare for cases of the virus, and it is very stressful for the staff. Claire's work permit and Licence to Practice came through just in time (praise God), and she and Barbara have been making face masks for the hospital staff.

Please keep Claire in your prayers as she has now returned to Maua to the Hospital, and Barbara, selfisolating in Kithoka.

Angleena Keizer – Israel/ Palestine – PH Day 15 In lockdown now since 5th March. She asks for prayers for:

- Gaza, where on 8th April, there were 13 cases. If it spreads it will be a catastrophe with limited resources and crowded population.
- Israel, in full lockdown, since the start of Passover; in particular for the Orthodox communities, if the virus spreads there.
- the estimated 35,000
 Palestinians returning from
 continuing to work in Israel on
 construction sites, and returning
 from Israel during the Passover
 holidays. It seems some are
 infected and the West Bank has
 limited resources to deal with a
 possible huge outbreak. So far
 the numbers are relatively small
 because they went immediately
 into lockdown. Pray for those
 returning, that it will be contained
 and not passed on to their
 families.
